Hermidale Future Farmers visit Ben Furney Flour Mills as their wheat crop gets turned into flour

Ben Furney Flour Mills welcomes the Hermidale Future Farmers to their mill in Dubbo, NSW this Wednesday, 7th of December.

The students at the tiny Hermidale Public School in Western NSW have just finished harvesting their first wheat crop with the help of their amazing community. As part of their three-year Cropping Immersion Project, the students will visit Ben Furney Flour Mills to watch how their wheat can be turned into flour. The visit will focus on the milling process and following the journey of a grain of wheat through to the final product, with a tour of the mill.

Ben Furney Flour Mills will be accepting 1 tonne of wheat from the Hermidale Future Farmers and in return will provide 1 pallet of various flour and stock feed products.

Not only is the Cropping Immersion Project expanding the student's knowledge of farming, working the land in a sustainable manner and the environmental implications of the agricultural sector, but the sale of the wheat will also earn the school approximately \$50,000. This money will be used to send the students on excursions around the country.

The students and teachers will be available from 11:30am - 11:50am on Wednesday at the Ben Furney Flour Mill office to be photographed and interviewed.
